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Scope and Status Definitions

A win in this report means any documented result or institutional gain that materially advanced AFLF/FRFT objectives: a removal, correction, review, acknowledgement, compliance response, agency disposition, formal record, enforcement pathway, verification safeguard, beneficiary-support structure, preservation outcome, or operational capacity gain. A current case entry means the matter is active, under monitoring, being prepared for response, or being supported through reports and documentation.

Completed correction	Language, branding, flyer content, event title, public representation, or platform content was changed after challenge.
Agency disposition	An agency processed the matter and issued an outcome, reprimand, record mark, disposition, or similar action.

AFLF/FRFT do not need every matter to become litigation for the work to produce an outcome. Many outcomes are pre-litigation results: a platform changes course, a government office logs a record, an organization responds, an evidence file becomes usable, a beneficiary receives a structured report, or a verification safeguard prevents misclassification.

AFLF maintains a public GoGetFunding campaign update log that operates as a running transparency record. The uploaded screen recording showed 517 campaign updates. This report does not treat each update as a separate completed win. Instead, the count is used as evidence of sustained public documentation, including formal notices, FOIA filings, agency complaints, platform enforcement, public statements, current work, and completed outcomes.
